WHAT IS A LOCAL COMPETITION?

An IAG Local Competition ensures the league or tournament is covered by all relative safeguards and provides best practice and support for organisers and participants. It also provides an online platform and App to manage data, generate fixtures, league tables and communicate with league participants directly. Playing an integral role in the sports' pathway, sanctioned Leagues will be an integral part of the Wheelchair Basketball family, providing local competitive opportunities in a more flexible environment.

WHAT IS INCLUDED IN A LOCAL COMPETITION?

Running a competition comes with a number of responsibilities when it comes to ensuring the safest possible environment. The BWB Sanction covers your organisation to ensure best possible governance and support. This includes:

- Public Liability and products liability insurance up to £10,000,00
- BWB governance, policies and procedures
- Safeguarding and Welfare support
- Rules and Disciplinary support
- Online digital system and mobile App compliant with GDPR and functions for:
 - Fixture Generation & League Tables
 - Member management and communication LOCAL LEAGUES
 - Instant results updating
 - Online fee collection
 - Events organisation and invites (eg organisation of AGM and Meetings)
 - Promotion and marketing of league in the lead up and during

WHAT IS THE CRITERIA?

In order for a Competition to be sanctioned, BWB require a small number of requirements to be met. Organisations must:

- Designate a Welfare Officer and Contact to liaise with BWB
- Submit a copy of rules and regulations
- Produce facility Risk Assessments
- Adhere to BWB Policies and Procedures
- Appoint a minimum of 1 qualified, registered BWB Referee
- Individuals must be registered as Members of BWB (ensuring enhanced personal accident insurance)
- Be registered with BWB as a Club/ Organisation (ensuring Professional Indemnity, Management, Abuse and Employers' Liability Insurance)
- Add value to the UK Competition pathway by providing positive playing opportunities for people not participating in BWB National Leagues and Competitions. This includes a commitment to support the development of teams to progress to their desired level within the established BWB UK Competition Pathway
- Administer their league fixtures, team sheets and league tables through the BWB Playwaze System and ensure all players and players and coaches produce a BWB license at games.

Data and GDPR

Local Competition Partner's (LCP) will commit to adopting the IAG Playwaze system for all aspects of the management of their IAG programmes.

As an IAG Playwaze LCP Community, the LCP will use all BWB systems in line with the British Wheelchair Basketball Terms of Use Policy.

All data supplied via the IAG programme will only be handled and used for its intended purpose and processed as detailed by British Wheelchair Basketball's Privacy Notice.

Local Competition Funding Criteria

The LCP will fulfil all commitments agreed to in the funding proposal once confirmed by the IAG programme manager.

The competition will have a focus on increasing participation and welcome new members to the game.

Work in partnership with other clubs or organisations to provide positive experiences for players

Providing a competition format with several dates throughout the season

Affiliation and registration on Playwaze of all those involved in the competition (clubs, players, coaches and officials)

Recruitment and Selection

The Recruitment and Selection of Local Competition Partners is at the sole discretion of British Wheelchair Basketball, with no right of appeal.

Commercial and Brand Rights

The Commercial and Brand Rights for British Wheelchair Basketball's Inspire a Generation Programme are wholly owned by British Wheelchair Basketball.

The team cost model for the Inspire a Generation courses will be decided by British Wheelchair Basketball, and reviewed annually.

Marketing and Marks

British Wheelchair Basketball must seek the Local Competition Partner's consent prior to using its name or mark in marketing materials or activities, with the exclusion of reporting, monitoring or evaluation activities where consent is not required.

LCP's must seek the consent of British Wheelchair Basketball prior to using or applying its name or mark, or that of its Inspire a Generation Programme, on any marketing assets or organisation applications or documentation.

The Reporting, Monitoring and Evaluation of the Inspire a Generation Programme will take place by British Wheelchair Basketball, and Loughborough University (as instructed by British Wheelchair Basketball).

LCP will support and facilitate British Wheelchair Basketball's reporting, monitoring and evaluation of IAG activities.

LCP accept that the outcomes of these reporting, monitoring and evaluation activities will be shared with Sport England, and may be publicly shared by Loughborough University (on BWB approval) or by British Wheelchair Basketball.



Governance

Local Competition Partners must, at a minimum, have in place a Safeguarding Policy, Health and Safety Policy, Code of Conduct and a Complaints/Disciplinary process.

British Wheelchair Basketball will govern Local Competition Partners via its own Disciplinary Policy, Code of Conduct, Safeguarding Policy, etc.

Any proven breach of British Wheelchair Basketball's policies may result in Local Competition Partners being removed from the Inspire a Generation Programme.

Local Competition Partners must immediately inform British Wheelchair Basketball of any significant governance breach or risk to programme reputation, as soon as it is aware.

Insurance and Memberships

Local Competition Partners must be affiliated to British Wheelchair Basketball as either a club or local delivery partner.

All Coaches or Activators must be current members of British Wheelchair Basketball and hold a valid licence.

This membership and licence validate that they are able to deliver BWB sanctioned activity and hold a current DBS.
